



Total Number of referrals received in Year Two – 868 This is an increase of 8% from Year One (797)

Homelessness Prevention - Year Two 2022/23











Prevention Referral Outcomes – Year 1 2021/22 v Year 2 2022/23



Year One (466) and Year Two (560) This is and increase of 17% for active work in providing housing advice, sustaining tenancies where possible or to terminate when appropriate to do so.


Homeless Applications - Year Two 2022/23



Total number of homeless applications for Year Two 22/23 is 307. This is a 7% reduction on Year One 21/22 (331)


Accommodation Outcomes – Year 1 (2021/22) v Year 2 (2022/23)

Accommodation Outcomes On Release; Comparing pilot first 4 months (Year 1), Full Year 1 (21/22) and Year 2 (22/23)




Referrals for Settled Accommodation – Year 1 (2021/22) v Year 2 (2022/23)
